Jesus Wept

At that time: When Jesus was come near to Jerusalem, He beheld the city, and wept over it, saying If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes.

—Luke 19:41-17

No man that hath read the history of the destruction of Jerusalem by the Roman Princes Vespasian and Titus, can be ignorant that it was of that destruction that the Lord spoke when He wept over the ruin of the city. It is these Princes that are pointed at where it is said "For the days shall come upon thee that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee." The truth of what followeth: "They shall not leave in thee one stone upon another" is even now fulfilled in the change of site of the city, which hath been rebuilt round about that place without the gates, where the Lord was crucified, while the ancient city hath been, as I am told, rooted up from the very foundations.

Miracles: The signs of the kingdom of God

"Jesus accompanies his words with many "mighty" works and wonders and signs", which manifest that the kingdom is present in him and attest that he was the promised Messiah.²⁶⁸ The signs worked by Jesus attest that the Father has sent him. They invite belief in him. 269 To those who turn to him in faith, he grants what they ask. 270 So miracles strengthen faith in the One who does his Father's works; they bear witness that he is the Son of God.²⁷¹ But his miracles can also be occasions for "offense";²⁷² they are not intended to satisfy people's curiosity or desire for magic. Despite his evident miracles some people reject Jesus; he is even accused of acting by the power of demons.²⁷³ By freeing some individuals from the earthly evils of hunger, injustice, illness and death, ²⁷⁴ Jesus performed messianic signs. Nevertheless he did not come to abolish all evils here below, ²⁷⁵ but to free men from the gravest slavery, sin ..." (CCC 547-549)
