I am pleased to inform you that the beautiful plaster and painting work in our church has been completed. New decorative vent covers fabricated by our team have been installed, and chandeliers hung with other complementary second-hand lighting fixtures. Work on the wood floor begins this week by our volunteers. After installed, the wood will be finished with oil and allowed to dry for up to ten days.

Last week we made final payment of \$22,750 to Tiedemann after depositing \$6000.00 for the church project, leaving a \$16,750 shortfall.

As you can see, we are still in need of your generous help. Please prayerfully consider my appeal for a gift of \$1,000 per family if you have not done so already.
